Working With Words

Phonemic Awareness Warm-Up

Blend: breath, sweat, spread **Segment:** head, dread, threat

Introduce/Review Target Concept

"Did you hear the /ĕ/ sound in all of those words? Today we will study a pattern that spells the /ĕ/ sound. You know that ea can often stand for the long e sound, but a little bit of the time, ea can stands for the sound /ĕ/, like in the words bread and head."

Read and Spell Words

High Frequency Words

Guide students to read blending lines.

Define *treads*: the part on the bottom of your sneakers that helps you not slip.

Spell and check: breath, dead, sweat.

No new high frequency words in this book. Review any HFW students may be unfamiliar with.

Reading the Text

Before Reading: Introduce Text and Key Vocabulary

"Read the title of this book—May's Big Race. In this book, May's whole family comes to watch her run in a race, including her grandmother, Po Po. You'll see Po Po's name in this book: here it is! But as May gets ready for her race, her family is very concerned. Say concerned. Concerned means worried. Read to find out what May's family is concerned about as she gets ready to run her race."

After Reading: Discuss

- "What were some of the things May's family was concerned about?"
- "Why did May say, 'Now I am ready' at the end?"
- "How does May feel about her family?"
